Celebrant

Through the Paschal mystery, dear friends, we are buried with Christ by Baptism into his death, and raised with him to newness of life. I call upon you, therefore, to renew the solemn promises and vows of Holy Baptism, by which we once renounced Satan and all his works, and promised to serve God faithfully in his holy Catholic Church.

Celebrant Do you reaffirm your renunciation of evil and renew your commitment to Jesus Christ?

People **I do.**

Celebrant Do you believe in God the Father?

People **I believe in God, the Father almighty,
creator of heaven and earth.**

Celebrant Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

People **I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord.
He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit
and born of the Virgin Mary.
He suffered under Pontius Pilate,
was crucified, died, and was buried.
He descended to the dead.
On the third day he rose again.
He ascended into heaven,
and is seated at the right hand of the Father.
He will come again to judge the living and the dead.**

Celebrant Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

People **I believe in the Holy Spirit,
the holy catholic Church,
the communion of saints,
the forgiveness of sins,
the resurrection of the body,
and the life everlasting.**

Celebrant Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?

Celebrant Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?

Celebrant

May Almighty God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has given us a new birth by water and the Holy Spirit, and bestowed upon us the forgiveness of sins, keep us in eternal life by his grace, in Christ Jesus our Lord. **Amen.**

The Prayers of the People

Presider: Your people are gathered together in this holy place, O God: Fill this house with the Spirit's presence and power as we pray to you: May these words of ours find favor; we will rejoice in the Holy One.

Litanist: Gracious and loving One, in Christ you have spoken your Word to us, and because we have seen Jesus, we have seen God the Father: Let our trust in your Spirit grow so fully that we may do the works that Christ has done, and greater works than these. May these words of ours find favor; **we will rejoice in the Holy One.**

Eternal One, scatter our pride and teach our leaders and all others who hold authority in the world to turn to you for instruction and truth. May these words of ours find favor; **we will rejoice in the Holy One.**

Ever-present One, in wisdom you have made all things, and the earth is full of your creatures: Pour out your Spirit upon all flesh and let the Comforter bring healing and peace to all who live with illness or suffering, oppression or injustice. May these words of ours find favor; **we will rejoice in the Holy One.**

Gracious One, let your deeds of power be with us in this community, that your sons and daughters may prophesy, your young men see visions, and your old men dream dreams. May these words of ours find favor; **we will rejoice in the Holy One.**

We rejoice that you promise to answer our prayers offered in Jesus' name. Listen to all who call to you for help and honor our prayers on behalf of those for whom we intercede, especially those we now mention aloud or in the silence of our hearts (pause); all those serving our country at home and abroad; and those on our prayer list. We give thanks for your benevolence and providence as we offer our prayers of gratitude and praise, especially for those celebrating birthdays and anniversaries Marvin, Vicky, Heather, Wendy, Doug & Lynn, Jim & Judy. The earth and all its people are yours, O God: Raise into your eternal presence all who have died, especially those we now remember aloud or in the silence of our hearts (pause). May these words of ours find favor; **we will rejoice in the Holy One.**

Presider: How manifold are your works, O Holy One; you open your hand and all your creatures are filled with good things: Let your Spirit abide with us and in us, that we may love you and keep your commandment to love one another, dwelling in the unity of the Son, who with the Father and the Holy Spirit lives and reigns, One God, for ever and ever. **Amen.**

Deacon Let us pray

Almighty Father, whose dear Son, on the night before He suffered, instituted the Sacrament of His Body and Blood: Mercifully grant that we may receive it thankfully in remembrance of Jesus Christ our Lord, Who in these holy mysteries gives us a pledge of eternal life, and Who lives and reigns for ever and ever. **Amen.**

And now, as our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to say,

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

Grant us therefore gracious Lord, so to eat the flesh of Your dear Son Jesus Christ, and to drink His blood, that we may evermore dwell in Him, and He in us. Amen.

Facing the people, the Deacon may say the following Invitation

The Gifts of God for the People of God.

Take them in remembrance that Christ died for you, and feed on him in your hearts by faith, with thanksgiving.

The Bread and the Cup are given to the communicants with these words

The Body of Christ, the bread of heaven. [*Amen.*]

The Blood of Christ, the cup of salvation. [*Amen.*]
